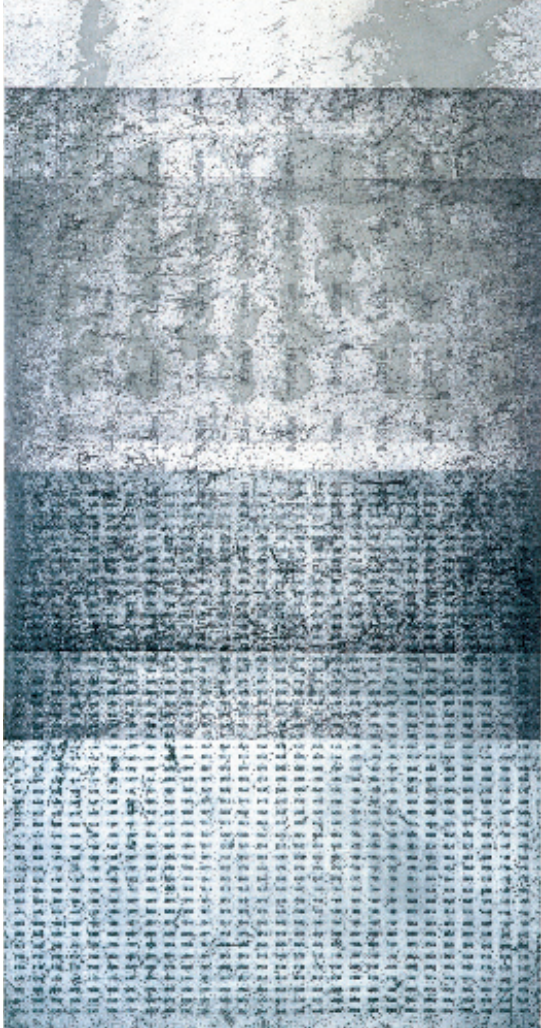


# 50 YEARS OF CLASSICAL STUDIES AT ANU
