Mary-Louise Williams has a Masters degree in History and Sociology from the University of NSW. She has been the director of the Commonwealth Government's only museum outside Canberra—the Australian National Maritime Museum—since November 2000. For 10 years before then she was Senior Curator and Assistant Director responsible for exhibitions and collections.

Ms Williams is a past board member and then Chairperson of the NSW Cultural Grants Advisory Council and has just finished eight years as board member then Chair of Museums and Galleries NSW. She is currently the Vice-President of the International Congress of Maritime Museums, a member of the Executive of the Council of Australian Museum Directors and on the board of the Foundation for the Search of Captain Cook's Ship *Endeavour* (Newport, USA). She has recently been appointed Deputy Chair of the Visions of Australia Commonwealth Government grant program. Ms Williams sits on several industry editorial boards in Australia and overseas.
