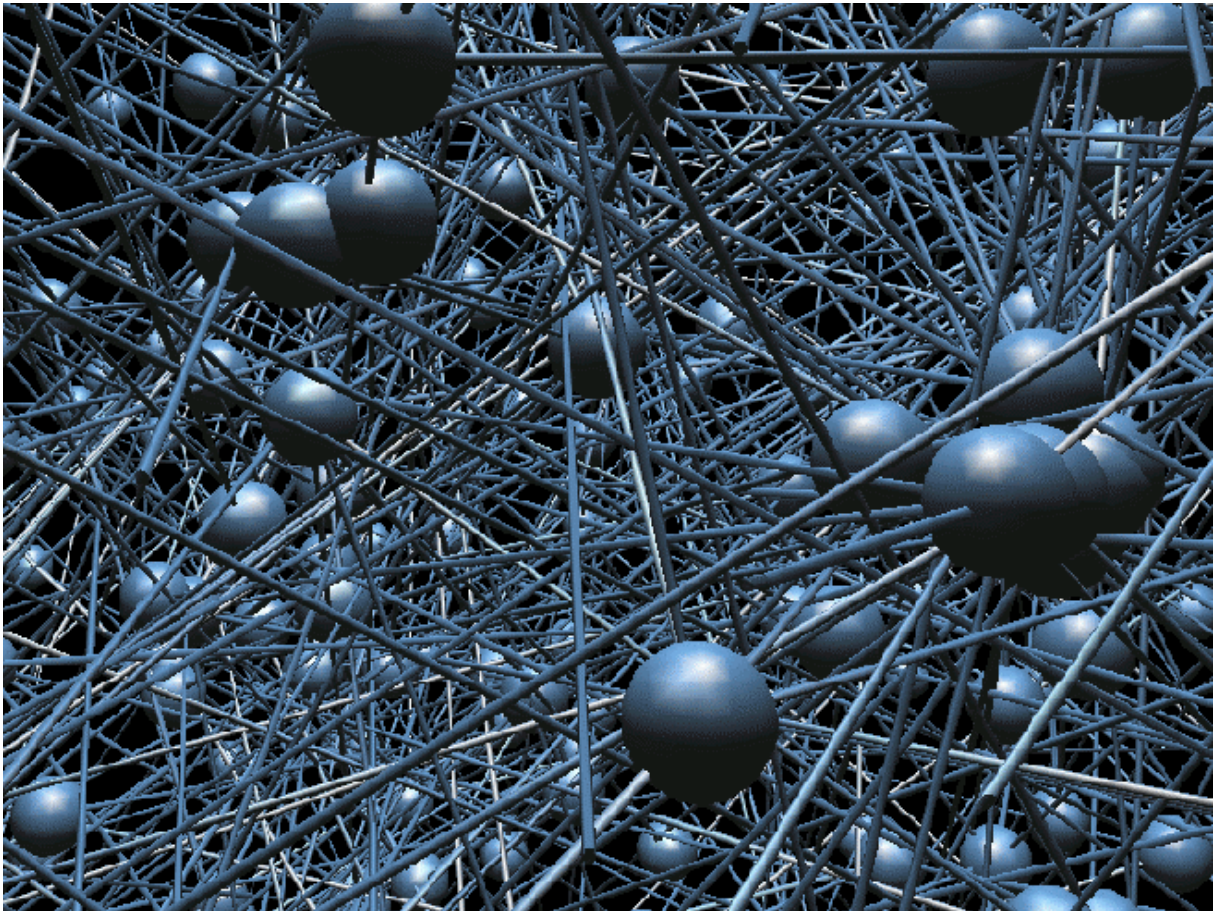


Image: The core ($n \approx 450$) of a social network of over 5,000 urban residents (in Canberra, Australia).
